The PAS and PAS process



What is a PAS?

A PAS is:

- a fast-track, consensus-based standardization option;
 - a form of standardization, the development process for which enables a new standard to be prepared and introduced to the market in a relatively short time scale whilst still adhering to the principles of consultation and consensus.

Note: Rapid introduction of a new standard can be particularly valuable in business sectors where the use of standards is not already a matter of routine, and for which the opportunity to apply and evaluate a new standard with a commitment to early review/ revision where required, can engender confidence.

Why develop a PAS?


- response to a pressing market need, often for an emergent market, technology, service or public policy interest;
- provides effective means of quickly introducing standardization;
- Useful for testing the validity of a particular approach or methodology;
- permits UK and international stakeholder engagement and applicability;
- used as a basis for formal standardization
 - (e.g. British, European or International Standards).
