	The Low Voltage Directive (LVD) requires all products placed on the market to be safe when used for its 'intended purpose' or 'under conditions that can be reasonably foreseen'. The 'new' LVD, which comes into effect April 2016, requires a documented risk assessment showing how the product meets its safety objectives - and taking into account what is 'reasonable foreseeable use' and what is 'misuse'.

Electrical Product Safety Conference 2015

'Safer by Design'

With goods moving freely across the single market, tracking products across the EU is a key priority in terms of consumer and product safety and business sustainability.

The growing complexity of the global supply chain – managing, monitoring and auditing the procurement, design, production, storage, transportation and distribution of products – presents significant traceability issues for businesses and is reflected in the low success rate of product recalls (and increased risk in relation to consumer safety).

During the passage of the Consumer Rights Act, Electrical Safety First lobbied hard for an



amendment providing greater transparency and improved communications around product recalls. While the amendment wasn't included in the legislation, the Charity was delighted that concerns were recognised by the Government, which established a Review of Recalled Consumer Products in March of this year.

Lynn Faulds Wood, who is leading this investigation, not only Chairs today's conference but also moderates our panel presentation discussing the outcomes of the Review. Representatives from key stakeholders will share their views on what they believe should be included in the Review's Report.

Our product safety conferences make a point of covering critical and emerging issues in the legislative landscape, so today's event will also bring us up-to-date with changes to the Low Voltage Directive (LVD), which comes into effect in the UK via the revised Electrical Equipment Safety Regulations in April 2016. The 'new' LVD explicitly requires a documented risk assessment showing how the product meets its safety objectives, including those of 'reasonable foreseeable use'. Using a real-life case study, the session will explore how test laboratories work with clients to ensure a product is safe before being placed in consumers' hands.

We are also using this event to launch the outcomes of our latest research project into the huge expansion in fake electrical products becoming available online.

The market for counterfeit goods in the UK is thought to be worth more than £1.3Billion each year. In addition to the safety risk counterfeits pose to consumers and their financial and reputational impact on legitimate business, an estimated £900 Million of the trade in fakes goes to organised crime gangs. And figures released by Trading Standards earlier this year, show that trading standards officers investigate more than 6,500 items a day to ensure that they are safe and the 'genuine article'. It may surprise some of you to know that almost half (two in every five) products reviewed by Trading Standards Officers at ports and borders, are identified as unsafe or noncompliant. Our report, A Shocking Rip-Off - The True Cost of Counterfeit Electrical Products - offers a series of recommendations to help stem this tide of fake products. We hope the report will not only stimulate debate but also lead to greater cooperation in addressing this increasingly critical issue.

Award-winning investigative journalist and TV presenter

Lynn presented the BBC's Watchdog programme for 10 years. She became particularly

well-known for confronting rogue traders and campaigning on unsafe products and recalls, instigating millions of pounds of design improvements globally - on everything from built in cookers and cots to cars and pen tops. She joined ITV's *World In Action* after her diagnosis with advanced bowel cancer and achieved audiences of over 10 million. She also co-founded and ran the European Cancer Patient Coalition and helped to develop the Cancer Plan for Europe. Lynn continues to work in TV and is currently independent chair of the BIS Review on Consumer Product Recall.


Toni Eldridge





Product Recall

Aim: Our Retail Recall campaign was part of a much wider focus for Electrical Safety First on improving the recall system and ensuring that no-one is living with a known, faulty electrical product in their home.

Strategy: We sought to achieve this through raising awareness of the importance of responding to recall notices and addressing public concerns around data collection. Consumers were encouraged to use an online product checker to verify the safety of their products and to streamline the recall process by registering their appliance.

Outcome:

- The campaign was judged a critical success, exceeding media targets in TV, radio, and print.
- Our annual consumer survey, conducted in April 2015, showed a 12% increase in the number of people who would act on an electrical product recall, highlighting the positive effect the campaign had on public perception.
- Our campaign was supported by a specially commissioned study on consumer experience of electrical product recalls which made recommendations for manufacturers and retailers to improve recall response rates.

Recent Campaign – 'A Killer Lurking'

In the spirit of Halloween, the Charity created an interactive game looking at the 'Killer Lurking' in your home.

As well as being a bit of fun, the game provided a valuable lesson on the unexpected dangers posed by recalled electrical products.

'A Killer Lurking's ultimate message is that both consumers and manufacturers can benefit from the registration of domestic appliances.

The game also links to useful online tools, such as AMDEA's Register my Appliance website and Electrical Safety First's own product recall checker web page.
